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FIRST USE

Your cordless telephone is a DECT™* standard appliance designed for transmitting and receiving telephone calls.

The Twist 397 is designed and manufactured for connection to the Belgacom analogue network.

It requires an electrical power supply in order to function.

1.1 INSTALLING THE BASE

1.1.1 Precautions

As with all radio communications, the signal quality will depend on the location and environment of the base and handset.

Your **Twist 397** must be kept away from sources of excessive heat (radiators, direct sunlight, etc.) and protected against vibrations and dust. Never allow your telephone to come into contact with water or other liquids, or with aerosols.

To reduce the risk of interference and optimise reception, take particular care not to install the base in the immediate vicinity of windows, large metal objects, reinforced concrete, televisions, music centres, halogen lamps or heating devices, fluorescent lighting, burglar alarms, microwave ovens, computers, etc. If connecting your telephone to a line used by an ADSL modem, remember to use an ADSL filter.

To clean your set, use an antistatic cloth lightly moistened with water.

1.1.2 Connecting the base

- Connect the phone cord and the power supply to the back of the base, as shown.
- Plug the telephone jack into the wall socket.
- Connect the mains adapter to a 230 V / 50 Hz power supply.
 - ▶ The green light on the base comes on and it beeps once.

1.1.3 Connecting the charger (Twist 397duo)


- Plug the red connector on the power supply to the red connector underneath the charger.
- Connect the mains adapter to a 230 V / 50 Hz power outlet.
 - Don't get the power supplies mixed up the red connector must be plugged into the charger.

1.2 INSTALLING THE HANDSET

Fitting the batteries and charging up for the first time

Once the base is connected, insert the batteries in the compartment at the back of the handset. Follow the signs telling you which way round the batteries go.



Before using for the first time, we recommend that you leave the handset to charge up on the base for 24 hours in order to optimise battery life and performance.

Place the handset on the base. The red light on the base comes on.

If the batteries are low, the too will continue to flash for several minutes after the red base light comes on.

Take the line ()

The tone confirms that the telephone is working. Check that the 🔌 symbol is on but not flashing.

If it is flashing, re-register the handset as shown in paragraph 8.1.

When the batteries are completely flat, put the handset back on its base; it may take several minutes for the display to light up again.

• Only use rechargeable batteries with exactly the same specifications as those supplied with the product.

Using non-rechargeable or non-conforming batteries can damage the product (see the "Technical Specifications" section).

Failure to comply with this recommendation will invalidate the manufacturer's warranty. The batteries could split or leak if incorrectly inserted, opened or exposed to heat.

Never dispose of batteries in a fire: they could explode.

1.3 USING THE HANDSET

1.3.1 Navigating through the menus

It's easy to adjust and customise your Twist 397 using its scrolling menu feature.

- To open the main menu, press OK.
- $\bullet~$ Use the ${\Delta}$ and ${\nabla}$ arrows to scroll through the options to find the one you want.
- To confirm an option, press OK.
- To return to the previous menu, press (1).
- To exit the menu and return to the home screen, hold the complex key down for 2 seconds.

1.3.2 Choosing the display language

Your Twist 397 has several language options for the menu.

To change the language (English by default):

- Open the menu by pressing OK.
- Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.
- Select "LANGUAGE" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○κ to confirm.
- Choose the language with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.

1.3.3 Turning the handset on/off

To avoid being disturbed by the handset ringing, or to save the batteries, you can turn the handset off:

- Press $\stackrel{\bigcirc{\mathbb{R}}}{\bigcirc}$ for at least 2 seconds and leave the handset off its base.
 - ▶ The display is off. You cannot make calls. If a call comes in, the handset will not ring. The base, however, will ring, unless its ringer has also been turned off.
- To reactivate the handset, do a long press on $\stackrel{\mathbb{R}}{\mathbb{O}}$ or place the handset on its base.

Note: When a call comes in, reactivate the handset and wait for it to ring before you take the line by pressing (1).

2. USING THE TELEPHONE

2.1 MAKING A CALL

Direct dialling


- Press
- Dial the number to be called.
- Press () to hang up at the end of the call.

Pre-dialling

With the pre-dialling feature you can enter and modify a number before making the call.

- Dial a number of up to 32 digits*.
- Press (()) to make a correction.
- Press () to initiate the call, and to hang up when you have finished.

To insert a pause, press ().



2.2 ANSWERING A CALL

When an external call comes in, the screen displays "CALL" and the EXT icon flashes.

If you subscribe to Belgacom's caller identification service, the caller's name or number can be displayed and memorised in the Calls Log (see Chapter 5, "Identifying Callers").

To take the call:

Press the key (3)

or

- Remove the handset from the base (see Section 6.4 "Auto-talk on/off").
- To adjust the earpiece volume, press ▲ (up) or ▼ (down).
- To hang up at the end of the call, press (1) or replace the handset on the base.

Reminder: If you have turned your handset off (see Section 1.3.3), it won't ring.

the If you dial a number containing more than 12 digits, only the last 12 digits appear on the display: the ◀ icon appears, meaning that there are other digits 'off-screen'.

Adjusting the ringer volume when a call comes in

Press \triangle and ∇ while the handset is ringing to turn the volume up or down. There are 5 volume settings; you can also turn the handset ringer off.

2.3 USING THE LOUDSPEAKER

The **Twist 397** handset has a loudspeaker function: you can bring people around you in on the conversation and use the handset in hands-free mode by putting it down next to you.

To activate the loudspeaker:

- Press 🔳
 - ▶ The ☐ icon appears.

To adjust the loudspeaker volume (5 volume settings):

Press ▲ or ▼.

To turn off the hands-free function and go back to using the handset:

Press
 .

2.4 REDIALLING ONE OF THE LAST NUMBERS CALLED (REDIAL)

The last 10 numbers dialled on your **Twist 397** are stored in the memory. The correspondents' names appear if they are listed in the phonebook.

To recall a correspondent:

- Press 🛦.
- Scroll through the names or numbers using the ▲ and ▼.
- To initiate the call, just press when you reach the name or number you want.
- To quit the list and return to the standby screen, press ()

To delete:

- To delete a number from the list, press confirm followed by confirm.
- To delete the whole list, hold confirm.
 - ▶ The set beeps to confirm.

To exit the menu, press (5)

2.5 ADJUSTING THE EARPIECE VOLUME

During a call, you can adjust the handset volume using the ♠ and ▼ keys: there are 5 volume settings.

2.6 SECRECY/MUTE FUNCTION (TURNING OFF THE MICROPHONE)

To put your correspondent on hold while you talk to someone next to you:

• Press ^C during the call.



- ▶ The display indicates that the handset microphone is deactivated; your correspondent can no longer hear you.
- Press (again to return to the call.

Note: You can't dial another number while the "Secrecy/Mute" function is active.

2.7 LOCATING A HANDSET (PAGING FUNCTION)

Forgotten where you left your handset?

 Press the key on the base. The handset(s) associated with the base will ring for 30 seconds.



When you find your handset:

Press the key again, or any handset key, to stop the ringer.

3. YOUR PHONEBOOK

Each handset contains a phonebook for up to 50 entries. Each entry contains the name and number of a contact.

Your phonebook will be erased if you have to reset your Twist 397 telephone (see Section 7.5 "Restoring the default settings").

3.1 MEMORISING NAMES AND NUMBERS

- Open the menu by pressing OK.
- Select "PHONEBOOK". Press OK to confirm.
- Select "ADD ENTRY". Press OK to confirm.
- Enter the name (max. 12 characters) using the alphanumeric keypad.

To select a letter, press the corresponding key as many times as required.

For example:

- for S, press (7 pq) 4 times,
- for E, press (3 de) twice.

If the next letter you want is on the same key, wait for the cursor to move on first, or press lacktriangledown

To enter a space: (1_{-}) . To make a correction: (1_{-}) .

- Press OK to confirm.
- Enter the number (max. 20 digits) and press occurrent to confirm.

Use the ▲ and ▼ keys to select the melody (from 1 to 10) to be associated with this number* and press ○K to confirm.



You can also create entries from the incoming Calls Log* (see Section 5.3).

3.2 USING THE PHONEBOOK TO MAKE CALLS

- Press to open the phonebook.
- · Key in the first letter of the name of the person you want to call.
 - ▶ The first name starting with that letter appears automatically. or
- Use the keys ▲ and ▼ keys to scroll through the phonebook.
- Press (3) to initiate the call.

If you want to check the number assigned to a particular name:

- Press OK again to return to the name.

To quit the phonebook, press $^{\circ}$ (()).


3.3 MODIFYING NAMES / NUMBERS

Press OK to open the menu.

Select "PHONEBOOK" and press OK to confirm.

- Select "MODIFY ENTRY" with the ▲ and ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.
- Select an entry with the ▲ and ▼ keys.

^{*} Requires subscription to the caller identification service.



• Use the continuous key to delete or correct the name, then enter the new name and press ok to confirm.

Use the ^C (R) key to delete or correct the number, then enter the new number and press (OK) to confirm.

You can also choose a different melody (from 1 to 10) for the number* using the ▲ and ▼ keys; press ok
 to confirm.

3.4 DELETING NAMES / NUMBERS

Press OK to open the menu.

Select "PHONEBOOK" and press OK to confirm.

Select "DELETE ENTRY" with the ▲ and ▼ keys and press (○κ) to confirm.

Select an entry with the ▲ and ▼ keys.

Validate your choice with OK .

▶ You get the message "CONFIRM?" – press ○K to delete the name (the associated number is deleted automatically) or ○((()) to cancel.

4. PHONEMAIL (1230)

Belgacom offers a voicemail/answering service on its network. You can have your calls diverted to a voicemail box when you are absent or already on the line. New messages are indicated by an icon on the display. For more details, contact Belgacom.

4.1 LISTENING TO VOICEMAIL MESSAGES

When new messages are received, the symbol • flashes on the display. To open your voicemail directly:

- Hold (1_) down for 2 seconds.
- When you have listened to all the messages, the icon on the display disappears. If it doesn't do so automatically, do a long press on (5).
 - ▶ The icon disappears from the display.

IDENTIFYING CALLERS

If you subscribe to the "Caller Number Identification" and/or "Caller Name Identification" service, you can identify your correspondent before you take the call.

The last 40 incoming calls (whether you answered them or not) are recorded in a log that stores the numbers, dates

During the call, and in the Calls Log, the following data is displayed:

Caller number		
Caller name	if the caller number is stored in your phonebook, or if you subscribe to the "Name Presentation" service.	
WITHHELD	if the caller is using CLIR (Caller Line Identification Restriction) to avoid identification.	
UNAVAILABLE	if the number cannot be transmitted by the network.	

READING THE CALLS LOG

If the log contains new calls, the are icon flashes on the display.

To listen to the calls:

- Press ▼.
- Scroll through the log with the ▲ and ▼ keys.
 - represents a call received but unanswered.
 - represents a call received and answered.
 - represents a call that has not yet been consulted in the log.
- Press to exit the log.

CALLING BACK A CORRESPONDENT FROM THE CALLS LOG

Select the name or number and press (3).

With the number showing on the display.

Press (OK) twice and validate "ADD?" by pressing (OK).

- Enter or modify the name and press OK to confirm.
 - ▶ The number appears.

- Press OK to confirm.
- Select the melody (from 1 to 10) to be associated with the number*.

Press OK to confirm.

DELETING THE CONTENT OF THE CALLS LOG

Press ▼.

To delete a call:

- Select the call you want to delete.
- Press ^C

Press OK to confirm.

DELETE?

To delete all the calls:

Hold down ^C ((§) for 2 seconds.

Press OK to confirm.

6. CUSTOMIZING YOUR HANDSET

6.1 BEEP TONES ON/OFF

Beep tones are emitted when you press a handset key, when the batteries are low, and when you are out of range.

Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.

Select "BEEP" and press OK to confirm.

Select "LOW BATTERY" and press
 ok to confirm.

- Select "OUT RANGE" and press OK to confirm.
- Choose "ON" to activate the beep or "OFF" to deactivate it, using the ▲ or ▼ keys.
- Press OK to confirm.

6.2 ADJUSTING THE RINGER VOLUME

menu

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Select "EXT RING VOL" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Set the volume level with the ▲ or ▼: keys either "VOLUME OFF" or a setting from 1 to 5 and press to confirm.
- If there is more than one handset, you can set the ringer volume for intercom calls in the same way, by selecting "INT RING VOL".

6.3 SELECTING A CALL MELODY

menu

- Press OK
- Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Using the ▲ or ▼ keys, select "EXT MELODY" (for incoming calls) or "INT MELODY" (for intercom calls between handsets) and press OK to confirm.

Choose your preferred melody (from 1 to 10) with the △ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.

Note: To select and adjust the call melody for the base, see Sections 7.1 and 7.2.

AUTO-TALK ON/OFF 6.4

The "Auto-talk" or "Auto-answer" feature is enabled by default.

It enables you to pick up calls by lifting the handset off the base, without having to press (



To turn this feature on or off:

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "HANDSET" with the \triangle or ∇ keys and press \bigcirc K to confirm.
- Select "AUTO ANSWER" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.
- Select "ON" or "OFF" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.

NAMING A HANDSET

You can change the name assigned to your handset.

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.
- Select "NAME" with the ${\Delta}$ or ${f \nabla}$ keys and press ${f \bigcirc}{\it K}$ to confirm.
- Press (1) to delete.
- Key in the name (max. 10 characters) and press OK to confirm.

SETTING THE TIME

To set the time on your telephone:

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "DATE-TIME" with the ▲ and ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.
- Select "TIME SETTING with the \triangle and ∇ keys and press $\bigcirc \kappa$ to confirm.
- Enter the time (HH:MM) and press OK to confirm.
- If you are subscribed to a caller line identification service, the date and time will be updated automatically.

Note: If the power supply is cut off, the clock will need to be reset.

6.7 ALARM ON/OFF

You can program your telephone's "Alarm" function.

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "DATE-TIME" with the $f \Delta$ or $f \nabla$ keys and press \bigodot to confirm.
- Select "ALARM SET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○κ to confirm.
- Select "ALARM ON" or "ALARM OFF" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ⊙κ to confirm.

If "ALARM ON" is selected, enter the time (HH:MM) and press (OK) to confirm.

To reset the alarm, repeat the above procedure.

6.8 KEYPAD LOCK ON/OFF

To avoid accidentally pressing keys on the handset when it is not on its base, you can temporarily lock the keypad (you can still receive calls).

To lock the keypad:

Hold down (*so) for 2 seconds.

or

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "HANDSET" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Select "KEYLOCK?" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
 - ▶ The □ icon appears on the display.

To unlock the keypad:

- · Press any key.
- Then press (★๑) as shown on the display.

7. BASE SETTINGS

7.1 CHOOSING THE RINGTONE

menu

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "SETUP" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○κ to confirm.
- Select "BASE MELODY" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.
- Choose one of the 5 melodies with the △ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.

7.2 ADJUSTING THE RINGER VOLUME

menu

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "SETUP" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.
- Select "BASE VOLUME" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Choose the preferred volume level with the ▲ or ▼ keys either "VOLUME OFF" or a setting from 1 to 5 and press occurrent to confirm.

7.3 SELECTING A BASE

Each handset can be associated ("registered") with up to 4 different DECT bases.

To select a base, you first need to register the handset with the base (see Section 8.1).

To select a base:

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "REGISTER" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.
- Select "SELECT BASE" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Select the base number from 1 to 4 by pressing the corresponding key, and press OK to confirm.
 - ▶ The number(s) of the selected base(s) will flash.

7.4 CHANGING THE PIN

The system PIN is used for registering new handsets with your Twist 397.

menu

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "SETUP" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.
- Select "PIN CODE" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.

Enter the 4 digits of the current PIN (0000 by default) and press ok to confirm.
 Enter the 4 digits of the new code and press ok to confirm.
 Enter the 4 digits of the new code and press ok to confirm.
 Enter the new PIN again for validation and press ok to confirm.

If you forget your PIN, you can return to the default code (0000).

Caution: this procedure will delete all the numbers stored in the phonebook (see Section 7.5).

To return to the default code:

- Take one of the batteries out of the handset.
- Press (**) and hold the key down while you reinsert the battery.
 - ▶ "DEFAULT" appears on the display.
- Release the (★∞) key.
- Press OK to confirm.
 - ▶ The PIN goes back to its default value: 0000.

7.5 RESTORING THE DEFAULT SETTINGS

You can always go back to the factory settings on your Twist 397.

! This procedure will erase the phonebook, Calls Log and recently dialled numbers list.

menu

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "SETUP" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○k to confirm.
- Select "DEFAULT" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Enter the system PIN (0000 by default) and validate by pressing ok twice.

8. USING YOUR TELEPHONE WITH MULTIPLE HANDSETS

8.1 REGISTERING A HANDSET

You can group together up to 5 handsets on your **Twist 397** base. If you already have 5 handsets and want to change one of them, you must first uninstall a handset (see next section) before installing the new one. The handsets delivered with your **Twist 397** are already registered on the base. If, however, one of them isn't getting the dial tone, follow the registration procedure:

On the base:

- men
- Press OK until you hear two beeps.
 - ▶ The green LED () on the base flashes. Your **Twist 397** base is now ready for registration with a new handset. This operation must be carried out within 90 seconds of pressing the () key.

On the handset:

- Press OK to open the menu.
- Select "REGISTER" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○K to confirm.
- Select "REG BASE" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press ○κ to confirm.
- Enter the base number for the handset (from 1 to 4) and press OK to confirm.

BASE 1 2 3 4

The flashing base numbers are those already used by other handsets.

- ▶ The display shows "SEARCHING..." (where N is the base number).
- ▶ The display shows: "PIN CODE".
- Enter the system PIN (0000 by default) and press OK to confirm.

*ඎ... SEARCHING...

- ▶ The handset is registered.
- If the handset can't find the base, it returns to its initial state after 2 minutes. Try again with a different base number, and make sure the environment is free from interference.

When a handset is registered on a base, it is automatically assigned a number (1 or 2), which appears on the right of the display. This is the number to be used for intercom calls.

Note: To cancel the registration in progress, remove the batteries.

8.2 UNINSTALLING A HANDSET

Press OK to open the menu.

Select "SETUP" with the ▲ or ▼ keys and press OK to confirm.

Select the handset to be uninstalled and press OK to confirm.

▶ The message "NOT REGISTER" appears on the uninstalled handset.

8.3 USING THE INTERCOM FEATURE

Calling an internal handset

Press (INT).

Enter the number of the handset you are calling.

When you receive an internal call, the number of the calling handset is displayed and the **INT** icon flashes.

Press () to answer.

8.4 TRANSFERRING AN OUTSIDE CALL TO ANOTHER HANDSET

To transfer a call with an external correspondent to another handset:

- Press (INT).
- Enter the number of the handset you want to call. The external correspondent is placed on hold.
- When the internal correspondent answers, press () to transfer the call.
- If the internal correspondent doesn't answer, press (NT) again to retrieve the external correspondent.

8.5 THREE-WAY CONFERENCE (2 INTERNAL PARTIES AND ONE EXTERNAL)

You can talk with an internal correspondent and an external correspondent at the same time.

When you are on the line with an external correspondent:

- Press (NT).
- Enter the number of the handset you want to call.
 - ▶ The external correspondent is placed on hold.
- When the internal correspondent answers, press (#) for 2 seconds.
- If the internal correspondent doesn't answer, press (NT) to retrieve the external correspondent.

8.6 ANSWERING AN OUTSIDE CALLER DURING AN INTERCOM CALL

If an outside call comes in while you are in intercom, you are alerted by a beep.

To take the call:

- Press 🕼 twice.
 - ▶ The internal communication is interrupted and you are put through to the outside caller.

As a general rule, try this first: remove the batteries from all the handsets in your installation and disconnect the power supply to the base. Wait for about 1 minute, then reconnect the base and reinstall the handset batteries.

11. GUARANTEE TERMS
